DRESS CODE: *Semi-Formal*

BOYS:

Collared Dress Shirt, Belt, **NO** Jeans and **NO** Flip-Flops

GIRLS:

Dresses or Dressy Pantsuits. Dress **MUST** come to **KNEE**, (if above knee, **must** wear leggings the entire evening). Dresses must meet the school dress code in terms of length, and must cover the midriff area (**NO** belly buttons showing). Cleavage must be within school dress code (**No lower than armpits**). **No** "bubble" dresses will be allowed.

These rules apply to the dance and to halftime court presentation.

Back of the dress **cannot** be lower than **mid-back**.

Strapless & Spaghetti straps are **allowed**.

NO Flip-Flops

DRESS CODE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

Any student who is not dressed appropriately will be asked to go home and change. Girls may put on leggings **UNDER** their dress in order to meet dress code. If the leggings are removed after entering the dance, the girl may be asked to leave the dance.

No refunds will be issued for dance tickets.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Fivay Parents and Students,

Please be aware of the attendance policy found in your school planners/student code of conduct on pages 10-11 of the planner.

Possible consequences for excessive absences: parking privileges revoked, driver license could be suspended, ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities, withdrawal for non-attendance. Your success is dependent on being in school in class.

As a summary, please note the following:

1. All absences are considered unexcused until a note is turned into student services.
2. **Notes must be turned in within the 3rd day of returning to school; any notes turned in after will not be excused.**
3. Your note must include your first and last name, student number, the dates absent and the reason for your absence.
4. If you know ahead of time that you will be out for 3 or more days, you must fill out a request to be absent form in Student Services so that it can be approved by administration and your teachers.

Some examples of **acceptable reasons** to be absent or tardy:

- Illness of student
- Major illness of family member of student
- Death in the family
- Religious holiday
- Doctor Appointment

Some examples of **inexcusable reasons** to be absent or tardy:

- Alarm did not go off
- Overslept
- Forgot homework
- Drove friend somewhere
- Car Trouble

If you are arriving late/tardy to school or leaving early only by parent permission, you must sign in or sign out in the front office. All students arriving late or checking out early **must do so through the front office.**

Thank you for your consideration as it will help keep your student successful in the classroom.

AP Literature

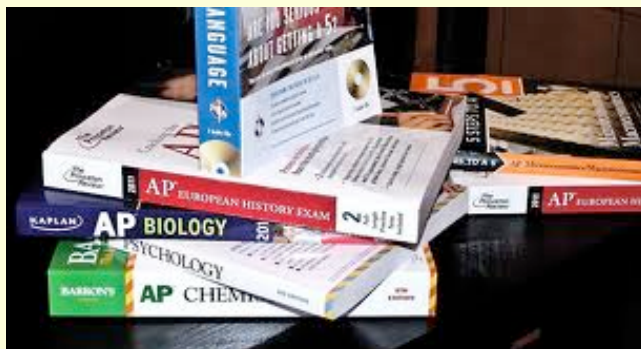

OUT-OF-FIELD TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS

Individuals who are teaching out-of-field are certified in at least one area and are qualified to teach but are required to take additional course work or testing to add a coverage/endorsement to their certificate. The state also requires a teacher to take coursework/inservice towards an English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) endorsement, when the teacher is the primary language arts provider and/or reading teacher for an ESOL student.

The following teachers have agreed to teach **OUT-OF-FIELD** while completing course work/testing: **Shawn Durand - ESE K-12 and ASD Endorsement; John Martin - ASD Endorsement; Jacilyn Justus - Reading Endorsement; and Amanda Nissen - Mathematics 6-12.**

STUDENT PARKING

Students parking at Fivay High School are required to display their valid parking permit in the lower left hand side of the windshield. Students who park on campus without the required permit may be booted at a fifteen-dollar expense to the owner. Also, students who are off-campus during the day for PHCC, OJT, or FLVS need to display an off-campus permit and park in the lot at the front of the school.

Flu Season Has Arrived October - May



What is the Flu?

Influenza, or “the flu,” is a highly contagious viral infection of the respiratory tract (nose, throat and lungs). The flu is often confused with the common cold, but flu symptoms tend to develop quickly (usually 1 to 4 days after a person is exposed to the flu virus) and are usually more severe than the typical sneezing and congestion associated with a cold.

Influenza is often accompanied with:

- Fever
- Headache
- Extreme tiredness
- Dry cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle aches
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhea are also common symptoms in children.

GOOD HEALTH HABITS

1. **Avoid Contact:** Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
2. **Stay home when you are sick:** If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.
3. **Cover your mouth and nose:** Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
4. **Clean your hands:** Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
5. **Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth:** Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
6. **Practice other good health habits:** Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.
