

Assessment Graduation Requirements

According to Florida law, students must meet certain academic requirements to earn a high school diploma from a public school including passing required courses and passing state-wide assessments. Passing scores for the statewide assessments are determined by the State Board of Education (SBE). The table provides the SBE scores for a concordant or comparative score.

Table 1: Assessment Requirement and Passing Score for Students who Entered Grade 9 in 2020-21 or Beyond

Students have multiple attempts to be administered the statewide assessments at the school in the Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer (new in 2024). Pasco County Schools provides an administration of the PSAT/ NMSQT to students in Grade 10 each fall and an administration of the SAT to students in Grade 11 each spring. Families may also register for administration of these other assessments (SAT, ACT, CLT) using the following links. Students would need to provide an official score report to the school.
